Survey update: School site uses in focus

Thanks to everyone who has participated so far in the recent Connecting Yarragon survey across summer. It's been great to have so many people willing to share their views and prepared to help shape Yarragon's future.

The Connecting Yarragon survey is part of an ongoing community engagement project this year to help update our local community plan. It's an opportunity to be heard, for which many people have expressed appreciation.

If you've been away and missed our household letterbox drop – or just had other family festivities on your mind, you can still jump online at connectingyarragon.com with your valued opinions and ideas. Whilst our official deadline for paper survey responses closed on 25 January 2018, we are happy to extend the **online** survey responses until COB Valentine's Day – 14 February 2018. So please don't miss this chance to add your voice.

There will be other opportunities to contribute your thoughts, ideas or artistic expression to the mix or simply comment on other people's ideas along the way too! You may be new to town, a regular visitor or a long-time resident or trader. All our opinions matter and people of all ages should be able to help shape Yarragon's future.

This survey is a key part of the 'Connecting Yarragon' project initiated by the YDCA and supported by the BBSN, with funding assistance from Baw Baw Shire Council. We all hope this project leads to a better understanding of Yarragon's future needs, and helps secure increased funding support for other local initiatives.

At present our project team is collating all the hard copy responses received so far and entering them online so we can extract relevant data of each section to share summaries of our community's views.

Old school site options

Our focus is initially on key questions relating to the use of the old Yarragon Primary School site in Rollo Street to help in local efforts to have this property purchased or transferred for community use.

We've provided feedback to Council officers for inclusion in current reports and recommendations to Councillors around investing in the site for public use. Our data is being linked in with the Shire's own online Have Your Say process to help gain a more comprehensive view. Given many of our older residents prefer to use hardcopy forms to respond, it's been valuable to share our information.

Whilst there may be variations on priority uses and minor overlap on some online submissions made directly to Council, our own data summary so far for Section 6 is very interesting. A new fire station, Community Hub for all ages, Community Gardens, Municipal Pool, Skatepark and various other public facilities and open space all rated highly as alternative uses for this now vacant land.

This data, combined with earlier feedback, gives clear direction for all future political discussions and lobbying activities. Please note that the strong majority view of the Yarragon community is very much in favour of Council investing in this site for local community use and benefit of future generations.

Next steps:

Understandably, it is a big job for our small group of volunteers to enter online all the remaining hardcopy responses and comments being collected from around town - so we will keep chipping away at that task this month. We do intend to generate some similar graphic overviews and comment summaries in coming weeks from all sections of the survey to share directly with local residents and the business community.

Future consultation activities being planned for 2018 include open houses, static information displays and artworks, group presentations and public forums. Keep an eye on our project updates and future events on connectingyarragon.com or via this newsletter.


Thanks again for all your support in getting involved in this process! It's been heartening to receive such a high level of response to the Connecting Yarragon survey - a great way to kick off 2018!

but we also had a few new stalls who we were happy to play host to.



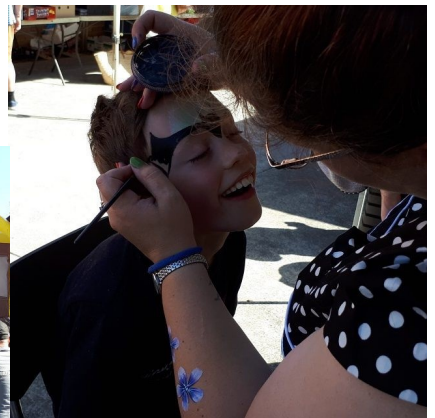

Many thanks again to everyone who supported our mega Christmas raffle by buying our tickets or giving us goods to put into the trailer or the other 5 prizes.

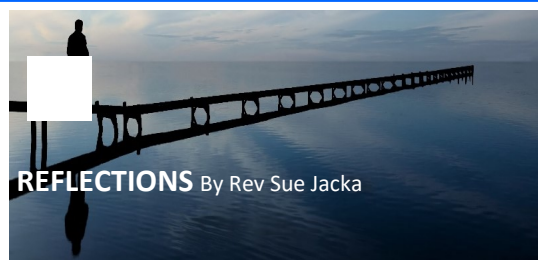

COMMUNITY VISITORS SCHEME

This is a program that links volunteers to older people who would benefit from companionship and friendship.

We have a number of funded visitor places available for people living in their own home in receipt of a Home Care Package or on a waiting list for a Home Care Package. The benefit of this program (CVS) is that it does not come out of their package – it is in addition and is free of charge to both the provider and recipient.

We hear often in the news and there have been a number of reports on the issue of isolation and loneliness in older people. This is not a reflection of their families it is just the way we live – many people have family who live far or interstate or because of the aging population their children are in their 60's and 70's too and dealing with health and other issues!

Although MS runs this service in Gippsland it is not limited to people living with multiple sclerosis, it is open to everyone. Our volunteers make weekly or fortnightly visits and sit and chat, go for a walk, coffee, play board games – the main objective is friendship that we have found develops into a strong, warm and genuine friendship. Our volunteers are from the local community and have the shared qualities of care and kindness.

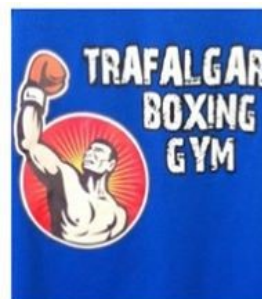

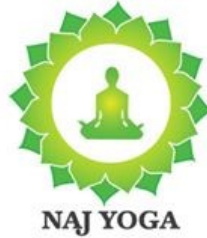
