





Among her many songs was one about a Homing Pigeon raised in the West End of Derby. As the story in the song goes, in 1913 there was a pigeon race starting from Rome. Among the birds sent from England was Charlie Hudson's prized bird. His mates down at the Pub told him he was foolish and he would lose his favourite bird. But Charlie had faith in his pigeon. So, as the song says "He put it in a basket and sent it to Rome".

Soon after the race began a huge storm came up and 500 birds were lost. You can imagine what Charlie's friends down at the Pub had to say. But Charlie kept his faith in his bird and, one day, there was a flash in the sky. There she was, his pigeon had come home!!

Reading the CD notes, I discovered the bird became the talk of Derby and was named the "King of Rome" and is now stuffed (after a long and happy life) and on display in the Derby Museum.


Well, my daughter has lived in Derby for many years and I have visited the small museum on my visits to see her. So of course, I had to check out this famous pigeon.

My first attempt was thwarted by indifference. When I enquired at the front desk I was told it was in the storage in the basement. My plea "But I have come all the way from Australia to see it!" fell on deaf ears. So I consoled myself with the historical artefacts of Derbyshire - exquisite pottery and fine china, stuffed animals, ice age relics and a long wooden boat, made from a huge log, recently dug up from the mud in a local river.

Two years later, on my next visit, I had another attempt to see this pigeon.

Again the young lady at the desk said "No" and again I protested that I had come "All the way from Australia!". tale of woe said, "just one moment, I will see what I can do". As I strolled around the usual Museum exhibits, a gentleman, Rick, approached me with a display box, under his arm. He asked if I was the person enquiring about the "King of Rome". We found a quiet room and he asked me to tell him what I knew about the pigeon and then he would tell me the rest of the story.

I told him about the June Tabor song. He then fleshed out the rest of the story. In the 1950s the Museum was undergoing refurbishment so the local paper did a front page story featuring the "King of Rome". A local folk singer saw the story and wrote a song about it. He then entered it in a folk song competition where one of the judges was June Tabor! The song got second prize and June Tabor asked if she could rework it and use it in her concerts. (It really is a beautiful song and always catches me whenever I listen to it). Rick was delighted that someone had come Australia to see "his pigeon". It wasn't kept in the basement, it lived on his desk!! He turned the case around to reveal a handsome pigeon proudly perched on a sturdy twig.

So we took some photos of each other with the pigeon and we both went home happy. I sent copies of the photos to my daughter to pass on to Rick, but when she went back to the Museum Rick had been made redundant! I thought that was the end of the story and the pigeon.

But, some years later when my daughter took her little girl for a visit to the museum there was the pigeon in its case on the wall!!! It has now been moved to the room with the stuffed foxes and owls. Now whenever I go to Derby, my granddaughter and I check that it is still there. Maybe my incessant visits from Australia stirred the museum staff into recognising the pigeon's importance!





# YARRAGON HISTORY

Trafalgar Yarragon Times Friday 22nd January 1915.

It is with relief that the outback settlers of Allambee at last begin to see the realisation of their hopes for the first three sections of the Yarragon/ Leongatha road have been let, and the work has been started. It will do an immeasurable amount of good to the town and district, for land that has been lying idle for years will be opened up and made available for settlers.

The land will grow crops to perfection, but the settlers had no heart to cultivate on account of the difficulty experienced in bringing their produce to market over the present roads. The lot of those who had to climb the Allambee hill in the past has not been a pleasant one, but looking ahead we can imagine a conversation like the following:

Outback farmer, to carrier, "Hullo, Billy! What do you think of the road now?"

Billy, "Quite a short way to Tipperary now—had 40 cans of cream and 3 horses yesterday. Remember the time I

had 14 cans of cream and 4 horses in and had to get a team of bullocks to pull me through the glue pot."

Outback farmer. "Yes! Not much to complain of now, is there?"

Billy, "Oh! Well, you know. I've got to pull off a good few times to let the motors pass, but I'll be having one myself soon, and if you haven't got your bally cans of cream ready when you hear me toot you'll have to bring 'em in yourself."

Farmer. "You carriers are beginning to think you are 'just it,' but I've still got my sledge left."

#### Volunteer with us!

Yarragon, like all CFA brigades, are always looking for new members to support our activities, and there is a role for everyone as a CFA volunteer! Not all roles in a brigade require you to attend an emergency, with operational roles and support roles in each brigade.

Many volunteers find that operational roles - responding to emergencies like fires and rescues are highly rewarding and give them valuable new skills. Whilst our volunteers in support roles make a huge contribution to getting Yarragon out into the community through fundraising and Yarragon CFA is just one of 1200 communities across Victo the CFA website to find where a Junior Development role, a Support role or even both. Program is, and you may find programs being run in some of our surrounding townships.

Operational roles at Yarragon CFA comprise of responding This may include:

- Responding to grass and bushfires
- Fires in homes, buildings and sheds
- Road accident rescues
- Hazardous materials
- Managing vegetation such as fuel reduction burns.

As a new operational member to the brigade, you will undertake CFA's General Fire Fighter training program, which will provide you with the skills and knowledge needed to be safe on the fireground. As you progress with your time in the brigade, additional learning programs around Bushfire, Structural Fires and Heavy Vehicle Driving will be available. If interested, additional training in speciality response roles such as Hazmat, Radio Operations and Incident Control can be undertaken.

Beyond emergency response, non-operational roles play a crucial part in our brigade supporting the community. There is so much more to the brigade than responding in the big red truck (or our little white community funded truck). There are a number of non-operational support

- Health and Safety
- Peer Support; Fostering a supportive environment for firefighters around fires
- Community Safety, Social Media and Engagement
- Community Events & Fundraising (I'm sure many of you have attended the Yarragon Book Fair before)
- Brigade business support roles, such as Administration, Finance, IT and Logistics.




